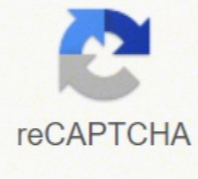

Perhaps that's what happens during the forging of a relationship: if nothing else, you adopt some of the other person's habits. It is directly addressed to the beloved who is gone, as Tanay, alone one day after his sister's return, tries to make sense of what has happened. His real pain he can share with no one. Straight from the horse's mouth Cobalt Blue is narrated by both Tanay and Anuja. He has no last name. The French connection, being a young orphan, and free-spiritedness seemed like a cliché at best. In short, the narrative didn't seem unbalanced to make me, as a reader, favour one's predicament over the other (which is often the case in dual/triple POV narratives). Now, for the things that didn't work. 1. It presents a slice of life, which offers more questions than answers. We had been given the freedom to choose how we want to live and behave. Like Anuja we too see him. "...as if in a series of images: working on a painting, cooking his food, listening to his walkman, leaning out of the window to pluck chafe flowers, playing the guitar". There is an underlying sense of betrayal and disappointment in the narrative tones. The author manages to capture the myriad of emotions and moods along with the vivid descriptions of a Maharashtrian household. Cobalt Blue is a sensitive portrayal of 2 individuals who are trying to come to terms with their identity. He has kept the pace and intensity of the book alive and even though I haven't read the original Marathi, the translation flows eloquently, and with a delicate refinement. By the time the novel ends, Tanay has left for Mumbai and Anuja has a home and a job, and a life to look forward to. When he runs away with Anuja, he overturns the family's lives. Lately, I've been on the hunt for works with unique storytelling (The Butcher Boy was the winner last year) as a fresh alternative to the linear manner we're all used to, and this book fit the bill perfectly. And as they claw their way out of their shock and grief, one is hopeful of a better ending for them. Family, absurd This is also a satire on family, a unit where everyone knows everyone yet no one truly knows anyone. I mean, we absorb them on the regular from blogs, our parents, gossiping relatives, TV series & movies, and so on, but to encounter them in books, especially those incorporated into the character building and agency, engenders a sense of renewed awe in a bookworm like me. Finally, both chapters contributed equally to the book narrative, with no one voice overpowering the other; they were different in their own right, but poignant nonetheless. That we are a transitional generation and that gave us several advantages. Its the story about a brother and sister who end up falling for their tenant. Tanay and Anuja are fascinated by the tenant who takes up lodging in their family home in Pune. From the core of his person, he came across as a vagabond with abandonment issues i.e., steered clear of human commitments for the fear of being left alone. I liked to see that journey pan out before me, although I had problems with a few of her other decisions. And all this to come from the mind of a 20-year-old is the icing on the cake. But their gender and their personalities shape their narratives, and we see two characters emerge before us. While Tanay emerges as more shy and introvert, Anuja comes across as more outspoken, bold and outgoing. This had the potential to be a talking point in the way Indian families discriminate in the upbringing of boys and girls. In a way it's also sort of a coming of age story. It imparts a vital lesson of accepting yourself, overcoming setbacks and starting life all over again. He seems like the perfect tenant, ready with the rent and happy to listen to their mother's musings on the imminent collapse of Indian culture. He leaves home without telling anyone that he won't be coming back anytime soon, making only a call to his sister. Slice of life nuggets: I am a sucker for these. It's a richly colored journey, tragic as it, and silently cheer as se learns to stand on her feet, learning to live alone. That I was different was nowhere apparent. Tanay's is a monologue, Anuja's, a diary entry. A picture does emerge, but still feels blurry and out of focus, as much for the reader as for the characters. In tone, Cobalt Blue thankfully falls in the first category, and in story, it explores an entirely different arc as Kundalkar weaves a poignant and touching tale of a brother-sister duo in love with the same man. Cobalt Blue is both typical and not in its portrayal of love, loss and longing: the holy trinity of the romance of life. It follows Tanay and Anuja, part of an average Indian family of five in a Maharashtrian town, and their unnamed paying guest who enters their life and turns it upside down. This is reminiscent of another character in another novel - Tridib, in The Shadow Lines by Amitav Ghosh. It is a coming of age story for both its characters, who learn so much about themselves and the world around them in the process of loving and being loved and rejection. I don't think I have come across many books that emote their main characters quite as well as the 20-year-old Kundalkar did, and here, I will take a moment to give supreme credit to Jerry Pinto's translation. But the experience seems doubly stifling for Tanay, who, even as he recovers from the shock of his beloved running away, must keep this from his family, to whom he has not come out. Anuja faces the 'shame' of a public 'wrongdoing', and Tanay, with no other way, disguises his grief as a brother for a brother for his sister, for that is the only way the family can accept his broken heart. She also breaks the gender stereotype of the passive woman, taking her life into her own hands especially in matters of independence and eloping. Her brother, by contrast, does this more furtively. Theirs is a typical Indian family, with traditional gender roles, dinner table woes, sibling rivalry, parental favouritism, secrets, patriarchal attitudes and more. Everyone in every family has an inner psychiatrist who rises to the occasion with some home-made mottoes, a few lines from a Jagjit Singh ghazal. "Suggested Readings: So Now You Know: Growing Up Gay in India by Vivek Tejuja is a memoir that brings to life the era of the nineties and the struggles of being gay. He has no family, no friends, no history, and no plans for the future. Unrequited love, and then some more The novel goes so much beyond just being a story of unrequited love, and thought provoking reach which leaves you with a mixed bag of emotions. It's common to hear stories of sisters falling in love with the same man or brothers in love with the same woman. The author does enough to make his influence and not him as the driving theme, without giving him a name or any other form of identity, although I think that did his character a disservice in that I at least needed to know what made him so attractive to his suitors. Perhaps this becomes symbolic of his life in his family, where as a gay young man who hasn't come out, he has to be surreptitious about all he does. Like Ghosh's work, here too the character is present despite his absence. The two halves fit together, but not perfectly.
