The original version, illustrated by the author herself, claims to be Harry Potter's copy of the textbook of the same name quoted in Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone (or Harry Potter and the Strecerer's Stone in the United States), the first novel in the Harry Potter series. It contains several handwritten notes by Harry, Ron Weasley and Hermione Granger, describing their experiences with some of the beasts depicted, including internal lines from the original series. In a 2001 interview with Scholastic Publisher, Rowling said he chose the topic of magical creatures because it was a funny topic for which he had already developed a lot of information in previous books. Rowling's name does not appear on the cover of the first edition, and the work is credited with the pseudonym "Newt Scamander", who wrote this textbook in the books as it appeared in Harry's list of supplies for his first year. The book benefits the BBC Comic Relief charity. Over 80% of the cover price of every book sold goes directly to poor children in various parts of the world. According to Comic Relief, sales of the book and its companion Quidditch Through the Ages had raised over £17 million by July 2009.[1] On September 12, 2013, Warner Bros. and Rowling announced that they would produce a film inspired by the book, the first of a series of five such films.[2] Rowling herself was the writer. She came up with a plan for a movie after Warner Bros. suggested the idea. The story features Newt Scamander as the protagonist and is set in New York City, 70 years before the beginning of Harry's story.[3] The film was released on November 18, 2016. On March 14, 2017, a new edition of the book was published, with cover illustrations by Jonny Duddle and interior illustrations by Tomislav Tomic, with six new creatures and a preface by Newt Scamander. It is assumed that this is a new copy since it does not contain any handwritten notes. The proceeds of this edition are donated to Lumos and Comic Relief. On 7 November 2017 it was a new edition with illustrations by Olivia Lomenech Gill, with the above text 2017. The 1st February 2018 a Kindle in edition, with these illustrations with motion, was released for compatible devices. Synopsis Original Version "for Babban!" Fantastic Beasts claims to be a reproduction of a textbook owned by Harry Potter and written by magtzoologist Newt Scamander, a character in the Harry Potter saga. In the series, magtzoology is the study of magical creatures. Albus Silente, head of Hogwarts, provides the preface and explains the purpose of the special edition of this book (the Comic Relief Charity). In the end, he assures the babbling readers: "The funny creatures described below are fictitious and cannot harm you". He repeats Hogwarts' motto: "Draco dormiens nunquam titillandus", which in Latin means "Never tickle a sleeping dragon."asts and Where to Find them contains the history of magizoology and describes 85 magical species found around the world. Scamander says he collected most of the information found in the book through observations made over years of travel to five continents. Note that the first edition was commissioned in 1918 by Augustus Worme of Obscurus Books. However, it was not published until 1927. It has reached its 52nd edition. In the Harry Potter universe, the book is a mandatory text for first-year Hogwarts students, having been approved since its first publication. In his preface to the book, Silent Albus notes that it serves as an excellent reference for witch families in addition to its use at Hogwarts. The book features scribbles and comments added by Ron Weasley. The commentaries seem to have been written around the period of the fourth book, Harry Potter and the Goblet of Fire. These doodles add some additional information for fans of the series (e.g. the article "Acromantula" has a commentary confirming that Hogwarts is in Scotland) along with comic reliefs (like Ron who says "You're not kidding" when he talks about the Hungarian hornmail as the most fearful dragon, a reference to Harry's encounter with one of the four books). The cover of the first edition of the book shows obvious signs of the claws of an unidentified animal.
