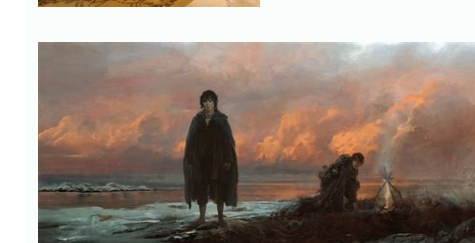
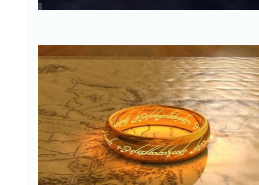
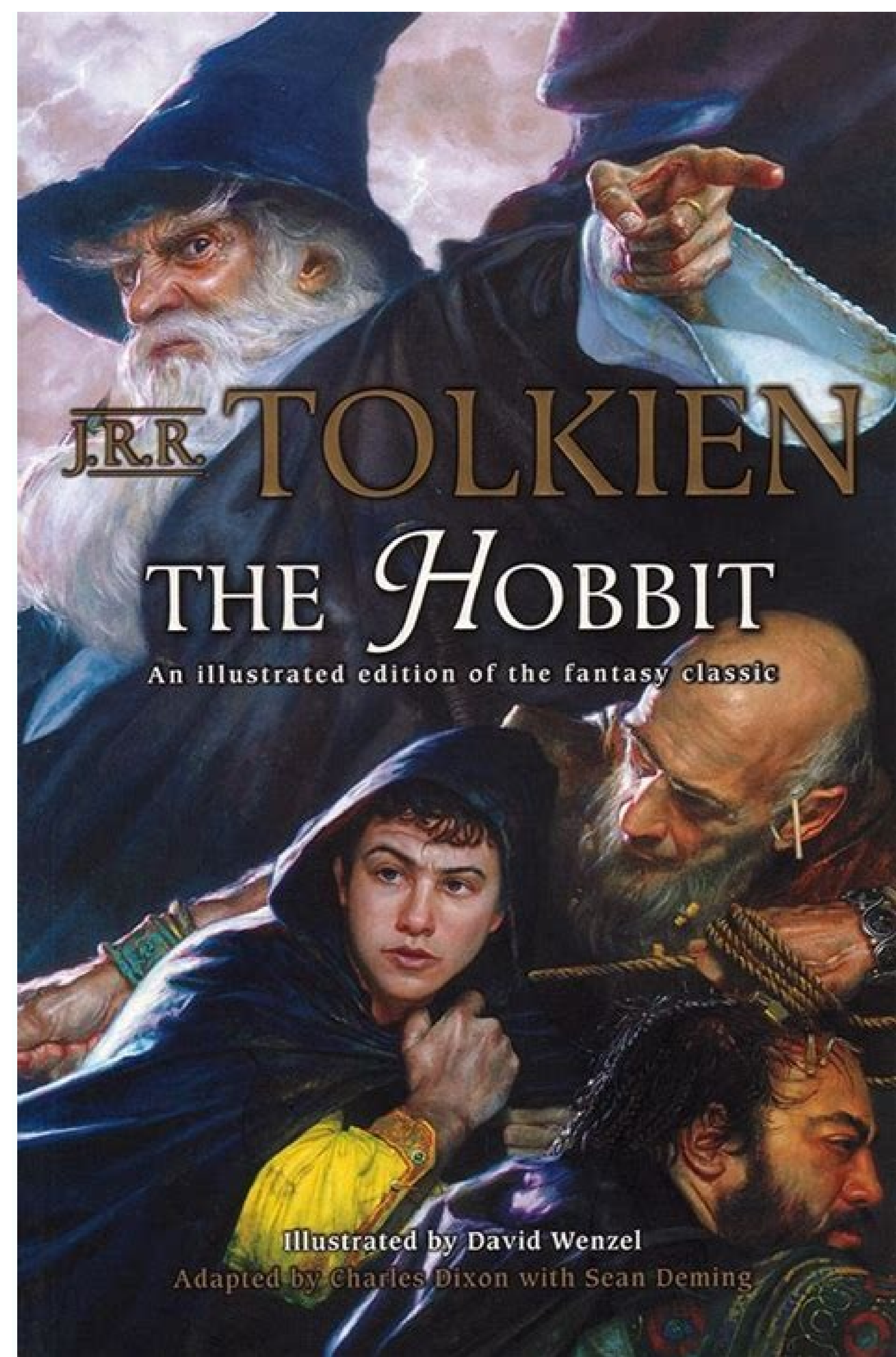

LOTR Tolkien takes a long time to carefully prepare the ground for all that is to come, so the first two chapters are very slow. However, if you can overcome them, things get a little better. Just like meeting new friends, it can be difficult to remember many words when reading them all at once. However, once you know the characters, and maybe read them again, it becomes a lot easier. I've also found that watching videos or even looking at illustrations of different characters is very helpful as it makes it easier to visualize the looks and, when watching videos, the voice of the different characters.
