Decorated by a professional with one of the largest oak desks I have ever seen, it made me feel even more out of my league. The branch manager made a lot of money and wasn't afraid to show it. The job market was poor with the dot-com bubble still having its effect on the economy and many of my college classmates were having trouble finding a job. This was my first "real" interview. Of course, I had interviewed McDonald, various mall jobs, and few office-type positions. But that was my career, and I wanted to be a financial advisor. Even though I had the support of one of the best producers in the office, I still had to get the blessing of the branch director. To do that, I had to do a fantastic interview. No pressure! Whether you're doing your first or your 400th interview, it's always possible that an interview question will take you flat. And since the interview is your prospective employer's first impression of you, even a poorly thoughtful answer can nix any hope you might have to work for the company. Find Job in Your Job Search Area Here are 10 common interview questions, along with the right and wrong way to answer them: 1. Tell me about yourself. This is probably the most common of all interview questions, and it looks like a soft ball. But if you're not prepared for this question, you might find your interviewer boring with stories about your family and your ever-growing collection of classic cars Matchbox. As with any interview question, you want to be prepared. Wrong answer: Getting too personal, being completely unprepared, or on the information that your interviewer doesn't need to know are all the characteristics of poor response to this query. If you find yourself stammering through an explanation of how your colon surgery has made it impossible for you to work for a couple of years so you are currently an expert in daytime TV, you have disgusted this response. Right answer: When an interviewer asks you this What they really want to know is who you are in your professional life. So, it is prepared with a one-minute summary of your professional career, touching only the staff if it had any effect on the professional. For example, if you're interviewing for a journalism position and it's been news and political politics since you were a kid, you might tell your interviewer that listening to Ross Perot's hilarious entertainment in 1992 the presidential debates sparked your interest in current events, which led to a degree in journalism followed by X, Y and Z. You work in the field. 2. Why are you interested in this work? This is a question where few interviewers really want an honest answer. The interviews would hardly move away from the ground if everyone answered this question with "the pay and benefits look good," or "I'm willing to take any work at this point because I need to put the food on the table. "What this question asks is how you would adapt to the culture of the organization. Wrong answer: focusing on what the job will give you is not what the interviewer wants to hear. Presumably, he or she already knows that the pay, benefits and benefits will be beneficial to whoever takes the position. Right answer: this is a question you need to put a little task in. You want to know as much as possible about the company you're interviewing with so that you can not only impress the interviewer with your knowledge of the organization, but so that you can also clarify which company you work there will be mutually beneficial. For example, an engineer might tell an automobile manufacturer that he believes in and is well informed about the cars they produce, and that the work will help us achieve his dream of helping Americans reduce their carbon footprint by continuing to work to continually improve efficiency as a company is known. 3. Where do you see yourself in x years? Interviewers are part of this question partly to see if your goals and expectations for yourself line up with those of the company. It can be a tricky question to maneuver, however, because I don't know your interviewer well. For example, stating that you would like to get to the point in your career where you are considered for promotions as the head of the department could simply rub the interviewer (who is the current head of the department) in the wrong way. So, how do you respond to this potential babe? Wrong answer: Providing your interviewer with too many specifications is a mistake. So, even if you have your entire career mapped out ahead of time, keep it to yourself. Right answer: this question is ultimately looking for proof that you are satisfied with the job to interview, but it will also be a go-getter who is willing to take more responsibility. One of the best to this question I have never seen was posted by L. Bosco on the Work Coach Café Blog: "I don't have a specific plan! I would like to move forward. However, I am flexible. I will do my current job to the best of my ability and keep an eye out for opportunities within the organization to move forward even if it means changing roles. I am ready to learn new things and contribute to the overall success of the organization in different ways. The only specific within that "availability plan" is that the opportunity is in my ability to learn, quite interesting for me to dig and do a good job, and the compensation increases a reasonable amount in relation to the claims of the location. - What's your biggest weakness? This is one of those interview questions that hardly seems right. Usually is a follow-up to what is your greatest strength? But it's a much harder question to answer right. Interviewers are flanked by the "I am an overachiever who does not know when to stop ..." do not answer this question, so it can be very hard to know the right way to answer. Wrong answer: both brutal honesty ("I'm a terrible procrastinator) and lying through the teeth ("I don't have any! ") are mistakes. Right answer: this is an opportunity to be honest about you while still giving the impression of being a great candidate. For example, you might tell the interviewer that your previous employer told you that he sometimes focused on the details when you needed to see more of the larger image. But don't stop there. So keep talking about what you've done to work on that flaw and use specific examples from your resume to back up your claims that you're working on this issue. You will earn points for honesty, and you will have turned this difficult question into a review of what you did and how you worked through a problem. 5. What are your salary requirements? A businessman once told me that the first person to name a number in any negotiation, "from haggling over the price of a car to wage negotiations - is the loser. So this question is definitely difficult. But on the other hand, it's important for you and the interviewer to know that you're on the same page financially. So how do you respond? Wrong answer: giving a specific amount of salary is generally a bad idea before you have received a job offer. In particular, you don't want to reveal what you're currently doing and use this as a benchmark for what you like to do: "I earned \$40,000 in my last job and I would love to go to at least \$45,000 to \$50,000". This is a mistake because you don't know yet what your job requirements will be. You could be low dancing your worth, in which case you could land the job but earn less than you can have, or you could prepare yourself from their reach, although you might be willing to less to work for that company. right answer: if possible, differ this conversation until you have a job offer or you are in an interview that includes human resources, indicating that a job offer probably imminent. What are the first five things you would do if I get this place? This is another question that could be potentially dangerous depending on who is interviewing you and how it feels about the location. Wrong answer: most people know that you don't have to answer this question with a list of attività 'da fannulloni: "Plan my first holiday, find the coffee machines" However, even go in the opposite direction and list Five ways to review the department or make great changes to current practices, can hurt you. Your interviewer could believe that things work well or have some specific ideas about what changes are needed that they are different from yours. Right answer: This is the time to focus on how it fits into the company and in the department you are joining. So, the answer to this question should start taking a while to learn culture and practices. You could say that you would like to start spending time with Team X or the Y department to learn what is more necessary from your position. But you don't want to postpone the issue that claims to need more information. In addition to giving some ideas about where to start learning about the processes of the company, you could even want to list two or three places that could potentially use some retouches, based on what you already know about the organization. A good answer could be this: "I would like to start knowing my team and the current infrastructure. I want to have a clear idea of what it is working and what can be improved before making any important decision. However, I have some ideas about it. For example, from what I read about your company, I know that finding a balance between customer satisfaction and cost reduction measures was a constant problem, so I would like to examine the possibility of listing some of the ideas that came to mind To solve problems, without giving the impression of trampling feet to anyone. 9. Unconventional demand. Many interviewers will ask a completely off-the-wall question to see how you do in a stressful situation. Some examples of these questions include: If you could compare yourself with any inanimate object, what would it be? And if you could be a superhero, what would your superpower be? Companies are turning to unconventional interview questions because they are much more difficult for a candidate to prepare for, and can often give the interviewer a better sense than a true candidate is. Wrong answer: "What? " Even if you feel completely at sea, don't let your interviewer see your confusion. Right answer: these questions are designed to take you off because presumably you are well prepared for the most common questions. make sure you take a moment to think about the question and tone of the interview and society before responding. You can also say something like: "Wow, this question is the first time for me. hmmm. to buy a little time to think about. So give an answer that is true for you ... if it means that you use light humor or answer the serious demand based on your understanding of the position. Your interviewer will be struck by being calm and find a creative answer. 10. What questions do you have for me? This is the classic interview, and has minated many an interview otherwise good. Wrong answer: There are two ways to answer this question incorrectly. The first is not to have prepared questions. This shows that you lack interest in the organization and has neglected to do any advanced research. The second is to ask only Auto-Serving questions. For example, if you ask for benefits, time of vacation or lifting potential or progress, make your interviewer. I think you are just interested in what the company can offer you. Right answer: Questions that focus on how to serve the company will help complete a great interview. For example, you could ask about specific projects on which you would work or how the department will take advantage of your specialized knowledge. In addition to these types of questions, asking for specifications of how the company works and what to expect from the location can indicate that you did your homework and we are really hoping to have a good impact on the organization. These questions include: What do you attribute to the success of your organization? And can you tell me why this location is open? And can you describe the ideal candidate for this position?
